Vocational Training: a new image

Statistics show that a lot of university graduates aren't getting jobs in their fields. At the same time, employers who want to hire plumbers, electricians or mechanics are having trouble finding skilled workers. This would suggest a greater demand for vocational training. However, that isn't happening as lots of young people drop out of school without any professional qualification.

Many people in Britain, including government officials, believe that the problem is in the educational system, which forces young people to take academic subjects, whether they are going to university or not.

To solve this problem, the British government is planning to make major changes in the educational system. Students who choose vocational training will be allowed to drop most of their academic subjects when they have reached the age of 14. They will then choose from a large selection of vocational subjects. Officials expect that after the changes are made; more students will be staying at school until the age of 18 because they will no longer feel that school is a waste of time.

Students are also going to have the opportunity to do on-the-job training as part of their schoolwork, allowing them to earn money, gain experience and receive educational qualifications at the same time.
