EJERCICIOS

Travelling to Mars, the Red Planet

A Dutch organisation, **Mars One**, is looking for volunteers for a flight that would take them to the Red Planet and leave them there. It will be a dangerous one-way journey to a distant world, leaving your family behind for the rest of your life.

Despite the obvious disadvantages, more than 200,000 people from around the world have applied for **Mars One**'s mission to establish a permanent human town on the Red Planet. This organization plans to collect the money, build the spaceship and launch the first colonists the next decade.

The first condition of candidate selection is being healthy. Candidates will have to provide medical certificates, signed by qualified doctors. The next step they need is to be good at working as a team. Any successful mission to Mars needs people who can work together calmly and safely, under sometimes life-threatening circumstances. So candidates will be invited to training sessions to prove they can work together. The last step is isolation. Potential astronauts will be closed in simulated spacecraft and isolation rooms for weeks. The aim of isolation, in a simulated Mars base, is to see how teams function together.

If volunteers are successful and pass all these stages, then they can expect another 10 years of intensive training to acquire the skills they will need for living on Mars: from flying a spaceship to repairing a Martian toilet. However, if **Mars One** manages to get the money to design and build a spacecraft ready to depart, there is no guarantee the candidates of this group will be selected for the mission.
